## 1. Education

**10TV SPECIAL PROJECT: “Silent Struggle: Surviving Sickle Cell.”** To raise awareness about Sickle Cell Disease, 10TV partnered with Radio One Stations Joy 106.3, Power 107.5 and Magic 98.9 to hold an all-day promotion and fund-raising event. The event, which ran from 6am to 9pm, consisted of television and radio promotions, a half-hour documentary that offered a comprehensive look at Sickle Cell Disease and its challenges and a telethon geared toward raising funds for research and treatment.
