6. Crime

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **“Deadly Ride.”** Janet Mixer, one of a handful of female students at the University of Michigan Law School in March of 1969, had just agreed to get married and had arranged a ride home to tell her parents. Her body was found in a small, rural cemetery just miles from her dorm. She had been shot twice in the head and strangled. Jane Mixer was the third of seven young women to be found dead in the area within two years. Shortly after finding the seventh victim, police arrested John Collins, an Eastern Michigan University student who was subsequently convicted of only one of the murders. Maggie Nelson, the daughter of Janet's sister Barbara, determined to write a book about her aunt and to unravel the mystery of her murder. Some detectives also believed the case merited another look. DNA tests of evidence at the scene of the crime led police to Gary Leiterman, a 62-year-old retired nurse and to John Ruelas, who was four-years-old at the time of the crime. Despite concerns over the possible contamination of DNA evidence and the absence of fingerprints, Gary Leiterman was tried and convicted of first degree murder and sentenced to life in prison. Leiterman, who maintains that he is innocent, plans to seek a new trial, challenging the DNA evidence. (C: Maureen Maher - Sr. P: Judy Tygard - P: Gail Abbott Zimmerman, Chris Young) (OAD: 11/26/05). 48 HOURS MYSTERY: **“Texas Confidential”** – follow-up to “The Bookie’s wife” (OAD: 01/11/02), a report on the 1997 murder of Doris Angleton, the wife of a successful Houston, Texas bookie. Doris' husband Bob, who claimed that his brother Roger was Doris' killer, was tried for the crime in state court and acquitted. More than three years later, federal prosecutors once more charged Bob with murder, planning to introduce new evidence -- an audio tape made by Vanessa Leggett, a true-crime writer who had interviewed Roger Angleton in jail. Four days before Bob's federal murder trial was to begin, he fled to Amsterdam using phony credentials. On arrival at the airport he was apprehended by Dutch officials. The United States asked the Dutch government to extradite him back home, but Angleton's lawyers cited an international treaty prohibiting the Dutch government from sending him back to Houston to face murder charges a second time. In September 2004, Bob Angleton was brought back to the U.S. He pled

guilty to passport and tax fraud and was sentenced to 12 years in federal prison. Once out of prison, the only way he can avoid another murder trial is to leave the U.S. forever. (C: Richard Schlesinger - Sr. P: Al Briganti - P: Loen Kelley) (OAD: 03/11/06) (N/PA) 8/8/06.

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **“Black Dahlia Confidential”**- the brutal murder in 1947 of Elizabeth Short, a young, struggling actress whose body was discovered in a vacant lot in January 1947, has baffled the Los Angeles Police Department for decades. After Short’s death, newspapers began calling her “The Black Dahlia” - the name taken from the movie of the time “The Blue Dahlia.” The case was made more intriguing by the fact that the killer sent handwritten notes to the tabloids, taunting authorities. Includes interviews with James Ellroy, a crime writer; former Los Angeles Detective Steve Hodel who has written a book, “Black Dahlia Avenger,” identifying his father, Dr. George Hodel, as the killer; Tamar Hodel, Steve Hodel’s half-sister; Michelle Philips, former singer with The Mamas And The Papas; Steven Kay, Deputy District Attorney; Dr. Mark Wallack, Chief of Surgery, St. Vincent’s Hospital; John Osborn, document examiner; and Suni Chapman, forensic artist. 7. War on Terrorism/National Security

Includes interviews with Lt. Col. Geoffrey Slack, of the New York National Guard; Captain Mike Melancon, of the Louisiana National Guard; and Hassan Ali, an Iraqi who drives the road every day. This is a CBS Network political panel program. Current issues are discussed with leading politicians, social leaders and activists.

48 HOURS MYSTERY SATURDAY 10:00 – 11:00 PM

This is a CBS Network public affairs program highlighting news, investigative reports and social issues. The program runs for an hour and that hour is normally dedicated to one story or stories that are on the same issue (i.e. child issues).
