DR. PHIL SHOW: **“When Good Kids Go Bad.”** What possesses a child to light a classmate on fire after a fight over a video game? When a young girl is brutally gang-raped, why do onlookers fail to intervene or call police? As a parent, would you ever think for a minute that your child could be capable of such horrific acts? How much responsibility falls on parents and teachers? Dr. Phil hears a firsthand account from people close to the case of the 15-year-old girl in Richmond, California, who was allegedly robbed, stripped, beaten and gang-raped while witnesses reportedly jeered and took cell phone photos. Schuler, who reportedly had a blood-alcohol level of twice the legal limit, caused a fatality accident that killed eight people, including four young children. DR. PHIL SHOW: "Easier Than You Think" When you think of a drug addicts, you probably think of people in a dark alley buying their poison from shady characters. Dr. Phil unites some of the Wesson women with two of Wesson's sons, who were also horrifically traumatized by their father before being abandoned in the mountains with no money, no education and no social skills. How did they survive? How can these extraordinary people overcome one of the most tragic family horror stories in decades? And what happens to them when the headlines go away? The toxicology report states that her blood alcohol level tested at twice the legal limit and marijuana was found in her system, but her husband believes otherwise. Oprah talks to the toxicologist on the case and the private investigator the Schuler family has hired. We'll also hear from Mike Bastardi, whose father and brother both died that night. Then, just two weeks ago, a weekend long slumber party turned deadly when another allegedly intoxicated mom, Carmen Huerta, got behind the wheel with seven young girls in the car. And, 11-year-old Kayla, who was one of the six survivors in the fatal car crash, tells what happened minutes before Carmen lost control of the vehicle. Plus, Lenny Rosado, the father of the young girl who lost her life, shares how he is coping with the tragic loss. 10/27/09

DR. PHIL SHOW: "Sins of a Father" Dr. Phil shines a spotlight on two horrific stories that shattered families forever. Nick says he was devastated when his stepfather, Michael Nicholaou, shot his stepmother and stepsister and then turned the gun on himself. But the grisly story doesn't end there. Michael is a possible suspect in a string of unsolved murders in the Connecticut River Valley in the mid-1980s. Then,

Jane was seven months pregnant when she was stabbed 27 times. For the first time, she'll meet Nick, the son of the man whom she believes attacked her. And, if you're suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder, Dr. Phil has tips to help you move past the pain. 10/27/09

DR. PHIL SHOW: **"Revenge: The Good, the Bad and the Ugly"** Bleach, bologna and super glue -- Do you know what these items have in common? They have all been used by people to get revenge against another.
