FACE THE NATION: Topics include: belief that had the proposed financial reform bill been in place in 2007, it would have prevented the 2008 financial crisis / Republican opposition to the bill / reasoning behind the bailout of General Motors / Obama Administration’s decision to hastily shelve the climate control bill in favor of the immigration bill. Guest: Larry Summers, Director, National Economic Council. 4/25/10

10TV News HD: “Primary Election.” 10TV produced extensive coverage of the May Primary election. 10TV provided stories to help voters become educated about the issues and races before election night. Then, on May 4th, voters across the state headed to the polls. 10TV had live reports on the web throughout the night and in our 11pm newscast. We covered all of the major contested statewide races as well as presented the match-ups for the November General Election. 10TV had reporters live on the scene covering Issue 1 and Issue 2, the major school issues and interviews with both Republican and Democratic winners. In addition to our election coverage, 10TV hosted a phone bank on Election Day from 6am-7pm with the League of Women Voters. FACE THE NATION: Topics include: confirmation that the Obama administration asked Congressman Sestak to bow out of the Senate Democratic primary race / commitment to the Democratic principles / factors behind Sestak's decision to run and eventual victory over incumbent Senator Specter. **Guests:** Representative Joe Sestak (D-PA), Democratic Candidate for Senate. 5/23/10

4. Health

10TV NEWS HD: **"Tularemia Bacteria Breakout"** The Columbus Health Department activated its emergency response system and notified the CDC after a monitoring system detected the dangerous bacteria in the air. At first, officials worried that it could be an indicator of a terrorist attack, but later they decided the equipment was overly sensitive, and there was no danger. 11pm TRT 1:10 (Kevin Landers and Andrea Cambern) 4/1/10

10TV NEWS HD: **"Prescription Drug Abuse"** In the past ten years, deaths from abusing prescription drugs have climbed 250 percent. So, today the Governor signed a bill creating a task force to come up with solutions to the problem. 6pm TRT: 1:38 (Cara Connelly) 4/2/10

10TV NEWS HD: More than 3,500 people have joined our YMCA Community Weight Loss Challenge. We profile one team, called the Stilletos. Four friends decided to help out a fifth woman, who wanted to lose weight in ten weeks. 5pm TRT: 1:33 (Andrea Cambern) 4/15/10

10TV NEWS HD: **"Oral Allergies"** A warm, dry spring resulted in a bumper crop of tree allergens, and without enough rain to wash them out of the air, allergists say their offices are very busy. Riverside allergist Dr. Don McNeil says some of his patients are now developing oral allergies to tree fruits, such as apples, because of the pollen problem. 10TV NEWS HD: **"New Salt Guidelines"** Americans eat about one and one half teaspoons of salt a day, but should eat only half of that. 10TV NEWS HD: **"Doctors New E.D."** Doctors Hospital opens a new emergency department. 5pm TRT: 44 (Andrea Cambern) 5/17/10

10TV NEWS HD: **"Sinus Treatment"** A doctor with Dublin Methodist Hospital is one of three physicians in the country testing an office procedure to open blocked sinus passages using a balloon catheter. It is a technique borrowed from heart doctors to open hearts and increase blood flow. 5pm TRT: 1:21 (Andrea Cambern) 5/21/10

10TV NEWS HD: **“Mental Health Bipolar”** In connection with Mental Health Month, we are doing a phone bank from 5pm through 6:30 with mental health professionals. We hear from a patient about what it is like to live with bipolar disorder. 5pm TRT: 1:41 (Jerry Revish) 5/25/10

10TV NEWS HD: **“Heart Failure Breakthrough”** OSU Cardiologist Dr. William Abraham announced the first breakthrough in the treatment of heart failure in a decade. He is using a tiny monitor on the pulmonary artery to warn doctors by computer of potential trouble, so they can do a better job of keeping heart failure patients breathing easier. 5pm TRT: 50 (Andrea Cambern) 6/15/10

5. Women’s Issues

10TV NEWS HD: **“Fayette County Birthing Center”** In the past 60 years, the staff at the Fayette Birthing Center has delivered 29,000 babies. But since staff there now is delivering only about one baby per day, the center can no longer afford to stay open. Mothers will have to go to Circleville or Columbus to have their babies. 5pm TRT: 1:19 (Tracy Townsend) 4/5/10

10TV NEWS HD: **“Healthcare and Women”** The new Obama healthcare bill will mean better maternity coverage for women. It also requires insurance plans to cover preventive care, such as mammograms and pap smears. Women we talked to largely seem to favor the expansion. But gynecologist Dr. Donald Bryan is concerned how the care will be paid for. 6pm TRT: 1:25 (Cara Connelly) 4/6/10

DR. PHIL SHOW: **“Are You a Modern Woman?”** What defines a contemporary woman? When Dr. Phil last tackled this topic, the conversation grew so intense, he had to keep the cameras rolling! Joining him to discuss motherhood and marriage is an expert panel of legal analysts, TV personalities and comedians. 4/9/10

DR. PHIL SHOW: **“Meddling Moms”** What happens when you can’t escape the tight grip your mother has on you? And as a mom, how do you know whether you’re caring or overbearing? Dr. Phil speaks with mothers who have a conflict with their child. 4/21/10

10TV NEWS HD: **“Older Mothers”** A report from the centers for Disease Control finds that the number of births dropped in every age group except for women over age 40. Ann Fein gave birth to her son at age forty and talks about how being older may make her a better mother. 10TV NEWS HD: **“Voluntary Mastectomy”** At age 29, Kelley Kochensparger was diagnosed with breast cancer. Since she had successfully battled skin cancer three years before, she says that she didn’t want to go through a cancer battle a third time, so though the cancer was just in one breast, she decided to have both breasts removed. Dr. Doreen Agnese of the OSU Comprehensive Cancer Center says an increasing number of women are making the same choice. DR. PHIL SHOW: **“Locate Your Love with Steve Harvey”** Most people know Steve Harvey as one of the original Kings of Comedy, but the funnyman is also author of the best-selling book *Act Like a Lady, Think Like a Man*. 10TV NEWS HD: **“Asthma and Pregnancy”** OSU lung specialist Dr. Jennifer McCallister says her research shows that more than half the time, when pregnant women have an asthma attack and go to the emergency department, they don’t get the right care. She says too many doctors worry about hurting the unborn baby, so they don’t prescribe steroids. She says steroids are safe for pregnant women, and without them, there is a greater risk of problems for the baby. 5pm TRT: 1:26 (Andrea Cambern) 6/16/10

DR. PHIL SHOW: **“Moms Who Drink”** There are killers among us, and they could take you or your loved one out. 6. Crime

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **“My Mother’s Murder”** - On the morning of June 5, 2005, Noura Jackson, a teenager, called the police to report that she had discovered the body of her mother, Jennifer Jackson, in their Memphis, Tennessee home. (C: Richard Schlesinger - P: Jay Young) 4/10/10

60 MINUTES: **“Gotti”** - an interview and profile of John Gotti Jr., son of the late convicted mafia boss John Gotti, head of the Gambino crime family. He discusses his infamous father, whom he strove to please by living a life of crime, and his eventual decision to leave that life. Also includes comments by his lawyer, Charles Carnesi, who was present during the interview. (C: Steve Kroft - P: Ira Rosen) 4/11/10

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **“An Invisible Enemy”** - a follow-up to “An Invisible Enemy” (OAD: 12/08/07). In January 2007, Cynthia Sommer was convicted of murdering her Marine Sgt. husband Todd in February 2002 with a lethal dose of arsenic. But ten months after her conviction, she was granted a new trial because of questions about the validity of the lab tests that found arsenic in some of Todd Sommer’s tissue samples but not in others. (C: Richard Schlesinger - P: Marcelena Spencer, Gayane Keshishyan) (OAD: 02/07/09; 1st Rebroadcast: 06/27/09, which included a brief update in the form of an onscreen text graphic at the conclusion.) 4/24/10

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **“Hannibal Unmasked”** - A report on the separate disappearances in 2003 of three young women in the Denver, Colorado area, and the investigations which not only eventually discovered the one individual who had known all three women, but led to his conviction as the killer of the three. (C: Harold Dow - P: Lourdes Aguiar) 4/24/10

10TV News HD: **“Failure to Report.”** Halfway houses provide transitional housing for many newly-released inmates in Ohio. But when ex-offenders take-off without permission, the houses are supposed to report that to the state. 10 Investigates discovered that doesn't always happen and sometimes, the story ends with violence. Paul Aker reports (L/N) 4/29/10, 6pm, TRT: 3:56

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **HOURS MYSTERY: “A Killer Defense”** - a report on the 2007 murder of Jennifer Turner, married but separated from North Carolina dentist, Dr. Kirk Turner, due to his infidelities with the family banker, Tondja Colvin. Kirk and Jennifer still maintained a lucrative horse farm, but Jennifer had filed for divorce and also brought an alienation of affection suit against Tondja. 5/1/10

48 HOURS MYSTERY: **48 HOURS MYSTERY – “Shelley’s Last Breath”** - an investigation into the 1999 scuba diving death of Shelley Tyre while on vacation on the Caribbean isle of Tortola. Police questioned her husband and dive partner David Swain about every detail of the dive; autopsy results were inconclusive. Shelley, a school principal who, in the early 1990s, had met and married David Swain, a divorced father of two, who ran a dive shop, was an adventurous woman who couldn’t care less about money. Her parents insisted on a pre-nuptial agreement and David Swain agreed he would receive no money if they divorced. With her death, he collected more than \$600,000 from her estate. 5/8/10

10TV News HD: **“CrimeTracker 10: Spring Cleanup – Sex Offenders.”** 10TV teamed up with the U.S. Marshals and CrimeStoppers to hunt for the most wanted sex offenders in central Ohio. Along with featuring the top ten every day for a week, 10TV hosted a phone bank to bring in tips concerning these offenders to CrimeStoppers. Angela An reports. (L/N) 5/10/10, 6pm, TRT: 3:07

48 HOURS MYSTERY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Betting Her Life" - a follow-up to "Right or Wrong" (OAD: 04/24/04, updated 01/01/08) - the story of Susan Wright, a 27-year-old stay-at-home mother from Houston, Texas who stabbed her husband, Jeff, 193 times. She claims she was a victim of domestic abuse and that on January 13, 2003, her husband attacked her with a knife and she fought back in self-defense. Prosecutors charged that she was a cold blooded killer who lured her husband to bed with the promise of sex, tied him up and then brutally murdered him. A jury found Susan Wright guilty of murder and sentenced her to 25 years in prison. 5/15/10

48 HOURS MYSTERY: 48 HOURS MYSTERY - "Deep Secret" - On June 21, 1977, eighteen-year-old Jeffrey Klee of Coral Springs, Florida, went out drinking with his best friend, David Cusanelli -- and never returned home. When police questioned Cusanelli, he told them that Jeff had dropped him off and then had headed home himself that night. Eventually investigators assumed that Jeff had run away. Thirty years passed. Then, in 2008, Klee's van was discovered in a Coral Springs canal which was being dredged for stolen vehicles. It contained Klee's skeletal remains and some personal possessions. Just two weeks prior to this discovery, Danna Holmes, a Coral Springs resident, told police that, in the year 2000, an inebriated man in a Coral Springs bar told her that he had accidentally killed his best friend. When she was shown a photo lineup to identify that man, she picked out David Cusanelli. 5/22/10

48 HOURS MYSTERY: "One of Their Own" - a report about how and why decorated female Los Angeles Police Detective Stephanie Lazarus was charged with the 1986 murder of Sherri Mae Rasmussen. The victim, newly married to John Ruetten, Lazarus' ex-boyfriend, was attacked, beaten and shot to death in her Los Angeles home. Police pursued a robbery motive, even though the only things missing were her car and her marriage certificate. For more than two decades, her father, Nels Rasmussen, has been on a frustrating quest to find out the truth about his daughter's murder. 5/22/10

48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Blood and Money On Horseshoe Bay" - a report on the November 2005 murder of Charlie White, a larger-than-life Texas millionaire who lived a lavish lifestyle in Horseshoe Bay, Texas. When police were called to White's lakeside mansion, they found his body, which had been brutally beaten, with an extension cord wrapped around his neck several times. By first impression, White was a very likeable person, but as police investigated his murder, a darker image of White emerged -- one of a cruel man with a dangerous mean streak sharpened by arrogance, alcohol, and women. 5/29/10

CBS NEWS SPECIAL BROADCAST - 60 MINUTES PRESENTS: "Gotti" - an expanded version of the 60 MINUTES double length segment "Gotti" (OAD: 04/11/10), an interview and profile of John Gotti, Jr., son of the late convicted mafia boss John Gotti, head of the Gambino crime family. He discusses his infamous father, whom he strove to please by living a life of crime, and his own eventual decision to leave that life. Also includes comments by his lawyer, Charles Carnesi, who was present during the interview. Previously un-aired material includes further comments and reflections by Gotti about his relationship with his father and about his own privacy now, and a look at his "Indian Room", a smoking room in his home that doubles as a shrine to famous Native Americans. FACE THE NATION: Topics include: reasoning behind the Obama Administration's agreement with Russia regarding nuclear security and nonproliferation / clarification of the major change to U.S. nuclear strategy -- that the United States will not use nuclear weapons against a non-nuclear state that attacked using chemical and biological weapons -- and the rationale behind it; missile defense system; reaction to rumors and reports regarding the behavior of Afghanistan's President Hamid Karzai / U.S. military campaign in Kandahar / positive evaluation of the current situation in Afghanistan; present situation in Iraq / assurance that U.S. troop withdrawal is on schedule; upcoming Nuclear Security Summit to be held in Washington, D.C. **Guests:** Hillary Clinton, Secretary of State (1); Robert Gates, Secretary of Defense (1); Jan Crawford 4/11/10

60 MINUTES: **"The Narrative"** - an interview and profile of Maajid Nawaz, a former leader of Hizb ut-Tahir, or Party of Liberation, one of Britain's most active Islamic extremist groups. After a prison term in Egypt and a break with his radical past, he co-founded a think tank, the Quilliam Foundation, and now speaks out in rebuttal of "the narrative" - an ideology that says that America is out to destroy Islam and Muslims. (C: Lesley Stahl - P: Richard Bonin) 4/25/10

FACE THE NATION: Topic: thwarted terrorist attack involving a bomb found in a smoking sports utility vehicle last night in Times Square, New York City. **Guests:** Bob Orr, Justice and Homeland Security Correspondent, CBS News. **Guest Moderator:** Harry Smith, Anchor, The Early Show. 5/2/10

FACE THE NATION: Topics include: discovery that the Times Square bomber Faisal Shazad was working on behalf of the Tehrik-I-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), and not alone, as had originally been believed / update on the ongoing investigation in the United States and Pakistan / praise for the intelligence and human effort that goes into preventing terrorist attacks / speculation as to the motive behind Shazad's attempted attack / strengths and weaknesses of the current system in place for monitoring potential terrorists. **Guest:** John Brennan, Assistant to the President for Counterterrorism and Homeland Security. 5/9/10

60 MINUTES: **"Homegrown Terror"** - a report on the incidence of American citizens who have traveled abroad for terrorist training by al Qaeda and their surrogates in order to attack America or its allies.
