DR PHIL: "Reckless Runaway Teen" Show #12057 (TV 14). Brandy and Graham say they have no idea how to control their 16-year-old daughter, Caitlin, who they say has been arrested seven times, dropped out of school and stolen their car at least 15 times. The parents claim that Caitlin is promiscuous, experiments with drugs and runs away from home for days at a time. They say they've tried everything --including using a GPS tracking anklet --to keep Caitlin from disappearing, but nothing seems to work. Caitlin admits that she has made some mistakes, but insists that she is mature enough to make her own decisions. Dr. Phil has some tough questions for the teen --and for Brandy and Graham about their parenting choices. Are they

contributing to their daughter's recklessness? And, how can they help her get back on track? Then, in September 2012, 21-year-old Brienna says intruders broke into her apartment, shot her in the head, execution style, and then shot her brother, Remi, and her roommate, Alex. Remi survived the shooting, but Alex was killed. Brienna says she is still struggling to cope --and even sleeps with a loaded gun by her bed every night. How can she begin to heal? 5. Women's Issues

DR PHIL: "Life Out of Order Because of My Disorder: Addicted to Pregnancy" Show #12074. Liz and Chris say that their four-year marriage is on the verge of divorce because of Liz's many addictions and illnesses. Liz admits that she struggles with multiple disorders --including OCD, bipolar, anxiety and panic disorders --and has jumped from one addiction to another since she was a teenager, including alcohol, cigarettes, prescription drugs, collecting pets and, currently, trying to get pregnant. Liz has four young children, two of them with Chris, and says that she's had multiple miscarriages since getting married. Despite the health risks, she insists that she doesn't think she'll ever stop wanting to have more kids --because she only feels fulfilled when she's pregnant or caring for a baby. Chris says that he's willing to do almost anything to make Liz happy, but the stress of living with her is taking a toll, so much so that he says he threatens divorce weekly. Dr. Phil weighs in --what does he think is driving Liz's addictions? Can she finally get the help she needs --and get her marriage back on track? Then, Sydney says that certain sounds, smells and ways that people touch her irritate her so much that she has to keep her distance from her fiancé, Michael, and their two children. She says she can't sleep in the same bed as Michael, share meals with her family or even cuddle with her children --and it breaks her heart. With a third baby on the way, how can Sydney overcome her extreme sensitivities? 1/2/14

10TV NEWS: Dozens attended a human trafficking awareness conference this morning to help shine line on human trafficking. "Break Every Chain" was held at the Reynoldsburg High School Summit campus. Organizers say the conference was aimed at raising awareness about the serious crime of exploitation in commercial sex or forced labor. 1/11/14 6 p.m. TRT: 1:00.

DR PHIL: "Bad Teen or Bad Mom?" Show #12081. Valerie says she's petrified of her angry 15-year-old daughter, Baylea, whose rages are so violent and out of control that the police are often called to intervene. Valerie says that during these incidents, her daughter turns into a "crazed animal," punching holes in walls, throwing items, and hitting and scratching herself --and she fears someone could get seriously hurt. Despite her efforts to control her daughter, Valerie says Baylea drinks, smokes marijuana and skips school. Can Dr. Phil help uncover what's at the root of Baylea's rage? Baylea's older sister, Chelsea, blames their mother for the teen's behavior, saying she acts more like Baylea's friend instead of a mother. Is this a case of a bad teenager or bad parenting? How does Baylea explain her actions? Valerie admits she's failing as a mother and needs guidance. 1/15/14

DR PHIL: "Pregnant and Out of Control: Will Her Baby Be Addicted?" Show #12093. Kristin says she's desperate for an intervention for her 18-year-old daughter, Sara, who is seven months pregnant, admits to smoking cigarettes and marijuana daily, and using cocaine and heroin. Kristin says she not only fears for Sara's life but is terrified for the welfare of her unborn grandson --and she doesn't know what to do. Sara says she's not worried about her drug use, because she has seen other expectant mothers do the same, and "their babies are fine." She says she's not an addict and insists she only makes bad choices when she's around her 20-year-old sister, Sadie, who is also abusing drugs. The siblings claim they haven't used any drugs in two weeks, except for marijuana. What will their drug tests reveal? And, Dr. Phil uncovers shocking details about their childhoods --is there a family legacy that needs to be broken? Plus, will Sara realize the dangers her unborn child could be facing? Don't miss this gripping two-part series. 1/27/14

DR PHIL: "Caught on Camera: Abused Wife or Abused Husband? You Decide" Show #12099. Marie says that her husband of 8 years, Ron, has a violent temper, and she's afraid for her safety and the safety of their 4-year-old daughter. She says that Ron's mood can change within seconds and claims that he has become verbally and physically abusive. She alleges that Ron has pushed her down the stairs and hit her in the head --and claims that he has threatened to do much worse, recently even writing "kill" on the bathroom mirror. Ron adamantly denies that he has ever physically or verbally abused Marie. He claims that she is a compulsive liar who often mixes her prescription medications with alcohol --and says that she has serious anger issues of her own. How does Marie respond? Is she telling the full truth about her husband's behaviors --and her own? Dr. Phil sorts through the allegations and looks at video from Dr. Phil cameras placed inside the family's home --what did they capture? Can Dr. Phil help this couple find a way to stop fighting and start communicating --for the sake of their child? 2/6/14

Recalling the day of the incident, she says she swung and missed her ex and instead struck his current wife in the collarbone. Marie sits down with Dr. Phil to set the record straight. Hear what she says caused her to carry out the violent act. And, her ex-husband, Carson, speaks out --how does he describe Marie's actions? DR PHIL: "Party Mom: Did She Put Her Children in Danger?" Show #12100. Twenty-three-year-old Mercedes says that her 38-year-old mother, Sueann, has been partying and drinking several days a week for the past 18 years -- forcing her to become a mother figure to her four younger siblings. She says that when she was a child, her mother often returned home intoxicated and initiated arguments -- if she came home at all -- and even took her to a bar when she was 15. Mercedes says despite an alcohol-related arrest and a mandatory rehab stint, her mother continues to drink excessively, and she's at her wits' end. Sueann admits that she goes out partying every week, and sometimes drinks until she blacks out, but insists she has always been a good mother. So, how does she explain losing custody of her 13-year-old son? Plus, hear from Sueann's 15-year-old daughter, Destiny, who got pregnant at just 12 years old. Why does she say she blames her mother? Can Dr. Phil help Sueann realize the damage her choices are causing her family? And, is she willing to stop the drinking and partying -- and be a mom? 3/5/14

DR PHIL: "My Husband Wants Me to Look Like Beyoncé" Show #12109. Marlon says his five-year marriage to his wife, Dedrea, is on the rocks because she has "let herself go," and he's ready to leave her if she doesn't "step it up." He says that he wants Dedrea to lose 20 pounds, wear more makeup and dress sexier -- to look more like his dream woman, Beyoncé -- while also cooking, cleaning and caring for their 5-year-old son. Marlon says he puts a lot of effort into his own appearance -- which he thinks is "close to perfect" -- and he doesn't understand why his wife doesn't do the same. Dedrea insists that Marlon's narcissism is the real problem in their marriage. She says that his many demands for her are unrealistic -- and have hurt her self-esteem. 3/11/14
