DR. PHIL: "Outrageous Parenting Dilemmas" - There's a fine line between helping your child realize their dream and pushing them too far. But how do you know when you cross it? Jay is a single dad to 13-year-old aspiring actress and model Rylee. He admits that he is overly critical of her appearance, restricts her diet, demands that she exercise twice a day and limits her time with friends --but insists it's only to help her realize her dreams. Is he pushing her too far? Pop icon Donny Osmond weighs in on the realities of

becoming a child star. Then, it's been nearly five years since George has seen or spoken to his only daughter, Amanda, and he wants to repair their broken relationship. He says since he divorced her mother, she's shut him out of her life and refuses all communication, even after a serious accident left him in a wheelchair. Amanda claims her father verbally and physically abused her throughout her childhood and never made her feel loved. She says she despises him and when she heard about his accident, thought, "Bad things happen to bad people." Can Dr. Phil help mend this father-daughter relationship? 4/12/12

DR. PHIL: "Mom Under Suspicion" - Sarah took her two young boys, ages 2 and 4, to the gas station and ended up missing for 13 hours. Then, one of Alicia's alleged attackers, Alexis, 13, says Alicia agreed to the fight, knew it would be videotaped, and that her ex-friend "deserved what she got and she'll get it again." Alexis' mother, Wendy, says she doesn't think her daughter is entirely to blame but admits that it's not the first time Alexis has gotten into trouble. She says the teen was accused of another assault and she worries Alexis will end up in jail if her anger isn't reeled in now. Then, 12-year-old Victoria admits to holding the camera and doing nothing to stop the fight. Now facing charges, Victoria's mom, Kara, speaks out on her behalf. 5/7/12

Unthinkable to most people, sexually-explicit images of children are being created and distributed by thousands of criminals across the country, causing long-lasting trauma and damage to innocent victims. Richelle and Travis say they know firsthand what happens when a child suffers from such horrific abuse. They adopted 5-year-old Michael, who was a victim of a child pornographer, and although they felt prepared to help him recover, they had no idea what to expect once he hit puberty. Now 13, are there signs Michael may be continuing the cycle of abuse? And, Alicia says she was a typical 13-year-old honor roll student when she befriended an older man online who made her feel special and important. What he does have is a 3-month old daughter with one teenage girl and a second child on the way, according to another. Autumn, 16, gave birth to Taten's daughter, Emma, in August and although Taten has cheated on her numerous times, and possibly fathered another child with her former best friend while pregnant with his baby, Autumn still wants Taten in her life. Autumn's mom, Michelle, couldn't feel more differently and says, "I wish Taten would drop off the face of the Earth." 48 HOURS MYSTERY - "Mystery on Twin Peaks Drive" - a report on the December 16, 1998 death of Ronda Reynolds, whose husband found her lifeless body with a gunshot wound to the head in her home on Twin Peaks Drive in Toledo, Washington. The death was quickly ruled a suicide. Refusing to accept the findings, Ronda's mother, Barb Thompson, launched her own investigation. She enlisted the help of world-famous true crime writer Ann Rule, who eventually wrote the bestseller "*In the Still of the Night*", about the case. Their investigation led Washington State authorities to revisit the case by holding a coroner's inquest - a rare and unusual proceeding -- to determine the cause of death and who might be responsible. The inquest resulted in the death being reclassified as a homicide and it determined that she had died at the hands of either her husband Ronald A. Reynolds and/or Ronald's son, Jonathan A. Reynolds. However, the Lewis County prosecutor announced he would not prosecute either man because most of the evidence had

been destroyed after Ronda's death.
