**FACE THE NATION** **SUNDAY** **10:30–11:00 AM**  
This is a CBS Network political panel program. Current issues are discussed with leading politicians, social leaders and activists.

**60 MINUTES** **SUNDAY** **7:00 – 8:00 PM**  
This is a CBS Network public affairs program highlighting news and social issues. Segments run for 7 - 8 minutes unless otherwise noted.
