This is a CBS Network political panel program. Current issues are discussed with leading politicians, social leaders and activists.

60 MINUTES **SUNDAY** **7:00 – 8:00 PM**
This is a CBS Network public affairs program highlighting news and social issues. Segments run for 7 - 8 minutes unless otherwise noted.

She says the taunting by her classmates escalated and forced her to quit school. Katie's mom, Giselle says her daughter --once, a popular cheerleader with good grades -- is now homeschooled and has lost everything. Giselle says her attempts to remedy the situation with parents and school officials fell on deaf ears, so she was forced to go to the police, resulting in backlash from her community. Giselle says she wants Nick and his parents, Michelle and Daniel, to take responsibility. 10TV News: "November Election Night Coverage." 10TV provided unprecedented local election night coverage on November 6, 2012. Hosted by Jerry Revish and Kristyn Hartman, 10TV produced an election night special on 10TV from 7pm-8pm. Then from 8pm-11pm, 10TV broadcasted live election coverage on 10.2, with local cut-ins twice an hour on 10.1. Tracy Townsend broke down the Electoral College in studio and Jim Heath used our 82 inch touch screen monitor and VoteTracker to show viewers who was voting for which presidential candidate in the state of Ohio throughout the night. In addition to our talent team, Jack Torry from The Columbus Dispatch provided in studio analysis as well as Terry Casey from the Republican side and Sam Gresham from the Democratic side. In the field, 10TV had two full crews at the Ohio Democratic Party event at the Hilton Downtown and at the Ohio Republican Party event at the Renaissance. Jessa Goddard was stationed at the Delaware County Bureau, Paul Aker covered the Secretary of State's Office at the Statehouse, Glenn McEntyre reported from The Columbus Dispatch as the reporters gathering information, Justin Moss covered State Issue 2 and Tanisha Mallett was all over central Ohio with the latest results on the school bonds and levies on the ballot. In addition to this local coverage, 10TV had feeds from both Chicago and Boston covering Obama and Romney. Throughout the night, 10TV was first on the air with results, the first with the big interviews and the first station to report when some of the biggest races of the night were called. Other races we covered on election night included U.S. Senate, Congressional Districts 3, 12 and 15, Franklin County Commissioner race and the three seats on the Ohio Supreme Court.

DR PHIL: "Anorexic and Drug Addicted: Saving Morgan" Show #11014 (TV 14 (S) (D)) One year ago, Bob and Ginger wrote Dr. Phil, desperately seeking help for their 29-year-old daughter, Morgan, who they said was slowly starving herself to death. At the time, Morgan was down to a mere 80 pounds, her organs had begun to shut down, her extremities were blue, and they said they believed Morgan's 20-year battle with anorexia was nearing a tragic end. With their plea for help answered, Morgan was scheduled to be a guest on Dr. Phil, but days before she was to appear on the show, she backed out, claiming she could "handle her own recovery." Now 120 pounds, Morgan has put on weight but says that she is treating her eating disorder --and the anxiety she feels from gaining weight --with the help of prescription pills. She

admits to sometimes taking as many as 20 Xanax in one day, and says she's so desperate to end her pain that she's put a gun to her head to end her life --four times. Morgan admits that she's become an "exceptional liar" and has deceived her way through seven treatment facilities. Her parents say they feel helpless, and her mother, Ginger, admits that sometimes she wishes, "God would just take her." Dr. Phil takes a close look into Morgan's family dynamics. How may her parents be enabling her behavior and jeopardizing her recovery? 10/10/12

Gina says Jeremy has wrestled her to the floor, choked her, cracked her teeth, slammed her head against a wall, beaten her with a belt buckle and driven a nail through her arm. And, when Gina was three months pregnant, she says Jeremy did the unthinkable --he raped her. What does Jeremy say happened? Find out why Gina says she believes Jeremy will kill her. Beth says her future mother-in-law is meddling, constantly berates her and is trying to destroy her relationship --and if she doesn't butt out, Beth says she'll be forced to end her relationship with Christian. How did the bad blood begin? Carol admits she doesn't trust Beth and even hired a private investigator to spy on her. Why doesn't she approve of Beth? And, what did the private investigator discover? Christian, who says he once had a great relationship with his mother, says he and Beth have canceled their wedding twice, in part due to his mother's behavior. Tiffany says she will oftentimes use corporal punishment as a consequence and admits to spanking her daughter until she was exhausted and telling her, "If I had a gun, I would have blown both of us away." Then, Karen admits that she feels resentment and anger toward her 14-year-old autistic daughter, Julia, and often thinks about running away. An examination of their cell phone records convinced police the women were lying. Investigators discovered that Robyn had recently lost her job, had gambling debts, and was on the verge of losing her house. Police believed one or both of the women shot and killed Brian Davis. Three years after the murder, Robyn and Sissy went on trial together. Several jurors expressed in interviews the opinion that investigators hadn't done their jobs and they had trouble with contradictions in Robyn's story. Jurors also learned of a life insurance policy that Robyn tried to cash in just two weeks after Brian's death. The jury vote was eleven for guilty and one for acquittal. In Louisiana, only 10 jurors are needed for a murder conviction: Robyn Davis and Sissy Saltzman are both convicted.
