This is a CBS Network public affairs program highlighting news, investigative reports and social issues. The program runs for an hour and that hour is normally dedicated to one story or stories that are on the same issue (i.e. child issues).

**FACE THE NATION** **SUNDAY** **10:30–11:00 AM**

This is a CBS Network political panel program. Current issues are discussed with leading politicians, social leaders and activists.

**60 MINUTES** **SUNDAY** **7:00 – 8:00 PM**

This is a CBS Network public affairs program highlighting news and social issues. Segments run for 7 - 8 minutes unless otherwise noted.

They say they've discovered that she's engaging in cybersex, sending and receiving nude photos on her phone, and has even run away four times --once to meet up with a 29-year-old man, with whom they say she had a sexual relationship. In an effort to tame the teen, they say they've taken away her phone and iPod and revoked Internet privileges. Deanna says she even quit her job to stay home and keep tabs on Miranda, but nothing has helped. Miranda says she wants to be loved by an adult male, and if she has to have sex to feel loved, then she will. How is Michael's role in his daughter's life influencing her decisions? Dr. Phil gives the teen's dad a wake-up call. Then, Dawn and John say that their

adopted 13-year-old daughter lies, steals and shows no remorse for her actions. Among her offenses, they say she ordered 77 adult movies and was playing a sexually inappropriate game with her 7-year-old brother. In an effort to protect their other children, the couple sent her to a facility for troubled teens. John says he doesn't want her to come home after her treatment, but Dawn disagrees, and it's tearing their marriage apart. How can they save their daughter without destroying their marriage? Sarah has had more than 100 plastic surgery procedures and doesn't plan to stop any time soon. She even made headlines for administering Botox to her 15-year-old and giving her 7-year-old a voucher for breast implants for when she turns 18. The show's co-host, E.R. physician Dr. Travis Stork, encouraged Sarah to meet with Dr. Phil. Is she addicted to going under the knife? Find out the horrific event that she says led to her plastic surgery obsession and why Dr. Phil is concerned about the message she's sending her daughters. Then, Debi says that after her 15-year-old daughter, Becca, lost weight, she not only started dressing sexy, she also started dating men in their 20s! Debi says that she battles with Becca daily about her inappropriate wardrobe and behavior and is now seeing her 8-year-old emulate her big sister. Elizabeth is a 22-year-old mother of four who allegedly glued her 2-year-old daughter, Joselyn's, hands to a wall and beat the child so severely that she landed in a coma for two days --all because the little girl refused to use the potty. Now, Joselyn and her three siblings live in foster care, while Elizabeth, pregnant with her fifth child, sits behind bars, facing charges of injury to a child. But is there more to this mom's story? Dr. Phil speaks to Elizabeth's cousin, Jessica, who says that there may be a reason why Elizabeth lost control. Find out what she says may have driven Elizabeth over the edge. **10TV NEWS HD: "10TV Show You Care & Vote Bus Tour."** As part of our commitment to encourage voter registration and education this election season, 10TV took our Show You Care & Vote bus to five different area college and university campuses. 10TV staff members, reporters and representatives from the Ohio Secretary of State's Office were all there to help people register to vote. We provided voter registration forms as well as provided applications for absentee ballots (all forms went directly back to the Secretary of State's Office after the event). So those on campus could register to vote for the first time, change their address if they were already registered, or apply to have their ballot mailed to a certain address. 10TV was live in the noon show each day that week.
